JULY 4TH CELEBRATION PARADES

The Native Sons of the Golden West (NSGW) is a fraternal service organization founded in California in 1875. It is dedicated to historic preservation and documentation of the state's historic structures and places, the placement of historic plaques, and other charitable functions in California. The NSGW Charitable Foundation annually donates to hospitals that treat children with cleft palates, and other forms of cranio-facial anomalies. NSGW provides scholarships by competitive application to High School seniors who are Native Sons, or are a relative of a Native Son, and have a desire to pursue higher education. NSGW also sponsors annually an history focused 4th Grade essay contest. **NSGW's motto is: Friendship, Loyalty, and Charity.**
